A singing, clapping crowd of 400 Negroes led by two white college professors surged into the downtown area Saturday following a ; "mourning march" for slain integration leader Medgar-Evers.

They were confronted by a massive and hurricity assembled array of blue-helmeled policemen, highway patrolinen, with riot guns, fire trueks and police dogs,

Police began loading the demonstrators into large trucks and hauling them to a stockade ringed by hog wire set up at the State Fair-grounds.
